		<p>We support the work done by UNTWO in drafting Statistical Framework for Measuring Sustainable Tourism (ST-MST) that will integrate statistics on the economic, environmental and social dimensions of sustainable tourism. ST-MST also has been further discussed during Seventh Meeting of the Technical Advisory Board (TAB) &amp; Eighteenth Meeting of the UNWTO Committee on Statistics and TSA at Madrid, Spain.</p> <p>It also good that ST-MST is streamlining the Tourism Statistics and TSA with SEEA. The ST-MST initiatives will facilitate countries in measuring the use of environmental flows, such as water and energy in tourism activity and the generation of environmental flows, such as GHG emissions, solid waste, wastewater and other pollutants, by tourism activity.</p> <p>Currently DOSM has developed two SEEA Physical Supply &amp; Use Table (PSUT) for Water and Energy accounts compiled based on 5 main economic sectors namely agriculture, mining and quarrying, construction, manufacturing and services.</p>
