The UNWTO/ICAO Ministerial Conference on Tourism and Air Transport in Africa will bring together key stakeholders and decision-makers of both sectors to discuss elements of a successful collaboration between the two sectors. Organized by Cabo Verde, the World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) and the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), UN specialized agency on international civil aviation standards and recommended practices and policies ICAO, and UN specialized agency for tourism UNWTO, the Conference will consist of four sessions on contemporary issues in tourism and aviation, and one ministerial discussion.

Programme of the Conference:

Session on Air Transport and Tourism Policy:

Air Transport and tourism depend heavily on each other and are essential engines of trade and economic growth for both developed and developing countries. This session will look at the regulatory framework and international cooperation in the two sectors.

Session on Air Connectivity:

Aviation and tourism are a customer-focused economic sector. With a focus on LDCs, LLDCs, and

SIDS, the session will look at regulatory schemes such as the recent Single Africa Air Transport Market.

Session on Funding and Financing for Development:

Infrastructure deficiencies in the aviation and tourism sectors have long been an issue in Africa. The creation of good governance and the consolidation of planning and development efforts for aviation and tourism infrastructure in multi-modal and urban planning initiatives will therefore be discussed.

Session on Travel Facilitation:

Travel facilitation aims at maximizing the efficiency of border clearance formalities while achieving and maintaining high-quality security and effective law enforcement. This session will look at best practices and the application of new technologies to make travel more accessible.

Ministerial Discussion and Declaration:

After reflecting on the UN SDGs and the AU's Agenda 2063, the conference will conclude with the drafting of the Ministerial Declaration and Action Plan.
