1. Registration

2. Thematic discussion on 'The Role of Tourism Routes in Fostering Regional Development and Integration'

The morning of 6 June, under agenda item 5, the Council will focus its thematic discussion on "The Role of Tourism Routes in Fostering Regional Development and Integration".

Tourism routes are an increasingly important component of national tourism planning and development offering important opportunities to foster regional development and integration.

UNWTO has gained significant knowledge over the years on the issue of tourism routes, namely through its Silk Road Programme; such knowledge, along with the numerous successful experiences of Member States worldwide in developing tourism routes, creates an opportunity to advance further this area of work within the Secretariat to the benefit of all Members.

The Secretariat thus invites delegations to share their experiences in the development of tourism routes during the thematic discussion. The Secretariat kindly requests delegations to focus their interventions

on key success factors and challenges of developing tourism routes, touching in particular on the following areas:

- (a) Accessibility, namely in terms of infrastructure development, transportation and visa facilitation in the case of transnational routes;
- (b) Product development, including successful strategies for integrated product development as well as the role of innovation and the use of new technologies;
- (c) Joint promotion and marketing, including the creation of the "route" brand;
- (d) Governance models, including public-private partnerships, public-public coordination and the creation of networks;
- (e) The role of national tourism administrations in promoting the creation and development of tourism routes; and
- (f) The inclusion of tourism routes as a component of regional development integration processes.

3. UNWTO Seminar on Tangible and Intangible Heritage and Innovative Tourism Products

The UNWTO Affiliate Members Programme, in collaboration with the UNESCO World Heritage Cities of Spain, will hold a Seminar on Public-Private Partnerships under the title "Tangible and Intangible Heritage and Innovative Tourism Products". 4. Accommodation


