Communication of the Chairman

Message of the Chairman of the UNWTO Executive Council, Mr. Carlos Ricardo Benavides Jiménez, Minister of Tourism of Costa Rica

Ladies and Gentlemen,

In my capacity as Chairman of the Executive Council of the World Tourism Organization, it is a great pleasure to bid you a most cordial welcome to Kish Island, Iran, which the *New York Times* ranked among the world's ten most beautiful islands in 2010. It is an island full of history, being mentioned as early as 325 BC as a strategic navigation point of Alexander the Great's fleet.

This has been a year in which tourism showed itself to be one of the world's most resilient activities. Throughout the planet, we can already see encouraging tourist arrival figures in all of our countries' destinations.

As I had mentioned at our meeting in Iguazu, the consequences of the volcanic eruption in Iceland has shown us the need for greater protection of travellers in the event of disasters in all parts of the world.
